OVER \$23 MILLION SPENT OVERPOLICING VACANT CALTRANS HOMES

Records provided by the California Highway Patrol reveal Caltrans Region 7 is paying \$23.5 million to the CHP to guard 138 empty Caltrans properties along the I-710 corridor in El Sereno, South Pasadena, and Pasadena over a 13-month period. In addition, Caltrans Region 7 has paid \$11.4 million over little more than a year to Inter Con Security, whose guards were pictured at the houses in news stories over the 2020 holiday period. Under the agreement with Caltrans, CHP launched "Operation 710 Trespass" on the eve of Thanksgiving 2020 to prevent unhoused mothers, children, and seniors from reclaiming the empty properties. CHP billed Caltrans \$3.1 million from November 25 - December 30, 2020, *
